

Competitive Sandwich Making

Preface:

This sport is intended to be a fun, easy thing to do, whether at parties, or in arenas. You can modify it however you want. The one thing I ask that you do not change is the core ideas.

The Rules:

- 1) There is to be no interference with a competitors sandwiches or sandwich-making ability. Any such interference shall be met with immediate expulsion from the competition, and barring from further competitions.*
- 2) All sandwiches must be complete. Completeness is described later.*
- 3) Judges are to be impartial local business owners or employees.*
- 4) All sandwiches produced in the event are to be consumed, post-event, by spectators, competitors, judges, venue owners, and the competition manager.*

Completeness Guidelines:

A sandwich is considered to be incomplete if:

- 1) It does not contain all the necessary ingredients, or is not in the correct size or shape.*
- 2) It has ingredients not called for in the current sandwich.*
- 3) Any spreadable ingredient is more than 2cm unspread from the edges, or is unevenly spread.*
- 4) The bread slices are misaligned by more than 2cm.*

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Hosting An Event:

Hosting an event requires no real investment. You must secure a venue, and you must provide ingredients. This is it. Beyond that, you should get people to attend, and possibly prizes of some sort. All that is up to you, but is not required. A tip, however: get a venue that has a commercial kitchen. This will make storing ingredients en masse so much easier, and will also allow you to sell foods.

Competition Manager Responsibilities:

Competition managers have very simple tasks: They must find judges, find contestants, and decide rules. The first 2 are very simple. The second has some caveats.

First off, I must list the types of competition:

- Head to Head

This is a simple 2 person competition, where the winner is the one who makes the most sandwiches in 30 minutes.

- Team Head to Head:

This is the same as traditional Head to Head, but with 2 teams facing off. Sandwich total is counted per team, not per-player.

- Endurance

This can have anywhere from 2 to 50 contestants, and the goal is to keep making sandwiches until everybody stops. The last person making sandwiches wins. If you do not make at least 1 sandwich every 5 minutes, you are considered as stopped.

Within these modes, you must choose 3 things: Sandwich size, sandwich shape, and sandwich type. You can be as extravagant as you want, but just remember that someone has to pay for all of it.
